V7 of WPATH has not been incorporated into NHS Scotland guidance and nir does NHS Scotland follow all of WPATH. Similarly, there are no plans for v 8 of WPATH to be incorporated or followed either. It is incorrect to state that the gender clinics follow the WPATH guidance.

The WPATH guidance is one reference that is consulted to inform gender clinic guidance, along with other references including Scottish and UK policies, local clinical practice, and representation from professional and public groups.
